What Do the Supreme Court Decisions Mean?

As everyone by now has heard, the [U.S. Supreme Court issued two rulings regarding marriage equality](#) on Wednesday, June 26. [Watch PFP members Tracy and Mia Levesque's reaction on 6ABC.](#) (Pictured, right, at the rally on Wednesday. Photo by Robert Moran, courtesy of [Philly.com.](#))



But what does the "demise of DOMA" (the federal Defense of Marriage Act) mean for those of us in Pennsylvania, New Jersey and Delaware? [Read this article by Mazzone Center legal director David Rosenblum](#) for an overview.

PFP member and family law attorney Tiffany Palmer said, "The Supreme Court's ruling in striking down federal DOMA was an exciting victory for LGBT equality. However this is not the end of the road for same-sex couples in Pennsylvania: it is just the beginning of seeking full equality."

Tiffany added that "for couples who have same-sex marriages and reside in Pennsylvania, whether your marriage will be recognized for federal purposes will vary based upon the federal agency and the particular benefit."



She also suggests consulting these [helpful fact sheets](#) that go over some of the federal rights and benefits to consider if you've been married in another state or are considering doing so.

In addition, Monday night, July 1, attorney Angela Giampolo will lead a [discussion and Q&A at Giovanni's Room](#) from 7:00-8:30pm on "DOMA Deconstructed" for those wishing to learn more about what the Supreme Court decisions mean for us in PA and NJ.

Leading up to the decisions' announcement, there was a [statewide marriage equality rally](#) held in Harrisburg on June 22. There was also a rally held near Independence Hall on "Decision Day" - both attended by many PFP families and organized by The Summit.

Before You Know It

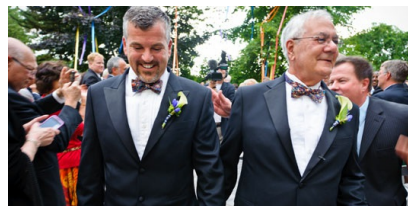
